Welcome to Spring

A warm welcome to the Spring Edition of the BCIC Newsletter—much has been achieved in Barrhill over the past twelve months, but we're sure you'll agree there's so much more we can do to make our village a better place to live. The new Learner Driver grant was introduced and Barrhill Playgroup received much needed funding for new play equipment. The BCIC supported the Barrhill Flower Show and the free community minibus hire was made available once again. In 2016, the BCIC invested a total of £9,439.00 in Grants and Bursaries and £19,350 was spent on Winter Fuel Payments.

Garden Maintenance—tenders welcome



The directors of the BCIC invite tenders from interested parties for either or both of the following pieces of work:

- ◆ To offer gardening services to eligible Barrhill residents (grass cutting/hedge trimming) once every two weeks, from April to the end of September. Current contract includes 9 gardens and 3 hedges.
- ◆ Garden maintenance of the Community Car Park borders and walkways.

Are you a resident of Barrhill? Over the age of 70? Do you have a health issue that makes cutting your own grass difficult?

Then now is the time to get in touch with the BCIC. We can arrange a grass cutting service between the months of April and October (this service is not available to people who live in council houses as they will be able to get the council to cut their grass).

The only stipulation is that the grass is of lawn standard to begin with. Get in touch with any BCIC Director for full details.

Ayrshire Rivers Trust—come and plant a tree

The BCIC are pleased to be supporting the Ayrshire Rivers Trust's Carrick Education Project, delivered to pupils at the Barrhill Primary School together with a further 9 primary schools within the Carrick area.

The first phase of the project focuses on introducing primary school pupils to their local stretch of river and the opportunity to learn about the fish in their river, the invertebrates that the fish feed on and why riparian trees are important for aquatic ecosystem functioning.




Barrhill Pupils enjoy the river

All this achieved through such activities as team challenges, woodland adventures, water-based sports and hill climbing.
